Present: Supervisors Hilmer, Faircloth, Anderson. Tama County Auditor Laura Kopsa, several members of the Tama County Against Wind Turbines Coalition. Deputy Sheriff Quandt was also present. Jon Winkelpleck spoke on behalf of Tama County Against Turbines. He stressed the need for a comprehensive commercial solar ordinance. He discussed the downfalls of having large solar farms in a county based on agriculture. Jim Husak spoke in favor of turbines and shared the benefits of having them. The group would like this done now before there are solar projects pending. The supervisors stated that they have not been approached by any solar companies about starting any projects in the county. The Supervisors are not in favor of a moratorium on solar at this time. Richard Arp asked about a comment on the recent Tama County audit regarding sales tax paid. The Auditor shared that this issue was addressed at the time of the audit and should not happen again.

A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS FOR THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT.

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2021, President Biden signed the 109 trillion-dollar American Rescue Plan Act and,

WHEREAS, Tama County applied for and has been received funds for the American Rescue Plan Act totaling \$3,200,000.00.

WHERAS, the Tama County Board of Supervisors has reviewed some requests and determined some that will qualify for the American Rescue Plan Act and

WHEREAS, based on the distribution guidelines from the US Department of Treasury, the following projects have been approved for the use in the second round of said funds:

- Tama Maintenance– Generators 136,000.00.
- Tama County Secondary Roads- Generators 116,000.00.
- Tama County Landfill Generator 20,000.00

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tama County Board of Supervisors endorses the disbursement of American Rescue Plan Act Funds for the items listed and authorizes the Auditor to make these payments as they are presented.
