Board of Supervisors Minutes April 21, 2025

The Tama County Board of Supervisors met at 8:30 a.m. April 21, 2025. Present: 1st District Supervisor, Curt Hilmer; 2nd District Supervisor, David Turner; 3rd District Supervisor, Heather Knebel; 4th District Supervisor, Mark Doland and 5th District Supervisor, Curt Kupka. Also, Tama County Auditor, Karen Rohrs, members of the public and Sheriff Schmidt.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Motion by Turner, seconded by Kupka to approve the agenda. Discussion: None. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Public Comments: Public comments were heard from Jim Smith, Laura Wilson, Karen Murty, and Richard Arp. Public comments closed at 8:39 am.

Motion by Kupka, seconded by Turner to approve the minutes of the April 14th regular meeting. Discussion: None. All voted aye. Motion carried.

The Board met with Ben Daleske, Tama County Engineer, to get a road projects report.

Supervisor Turner asked to continue research regarding power over the Ethernet for the new phone system for the next couple of weeks. He stated he had been approached by Aureon asking if the county would entertain using them as a director. He asked that this item be on the agenda for the next few weeks until we get an IT Director.

There were no hiring freeze exemptions to act on.

Motion by Hilmer, seconded by Knebel to approve the claims for payment as presented in the amount of \$103,459.07. Discussion: None. All voted aye. Motion carried.

At 8:45 am the Board held a public hearing to receive comments on the proposed county budget for Fiscal Year 2025-2026. Motion by Knebel, seconded by Turner to open the public hearing. All voted aye. Motion carried. There were members of the public present. Public comments: No written comments were received. Questions about the budget and comments were heard from the public. Motion by Turner, seconded by Knebel to close the public hearing. Chairman Doland closed the public hearing at 8:55 am. All voted aye. Motion carried. Motion by Turner, seconded by Hilmer to approve the total amount of property taxes levied at \$13,093,274, an increase of \$1,107,190 from last year due to an increase from the voter approved EMS Levy and increased assessed property value and to approve the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 4-21-2025A

The Board of Supervisors of Tama County hereby approves and adopts the 2025-2026 fiscal year budget making the total property taxes levied \$13,093,274. The Board further notes that the budget was published in official newspapers for Tama County and orders the budget to be certified and filed with/by the Tama County Auditor, as required by law.

Roll Call Vote: Hilmer, aye. Turner, aye. Knebel, aye. Doland, aye. Kupka, aye. Resolution passed and adopted this 21st day of April, 2025. Mark Doland, Chairman, Board of Supervisors. Karen Rohrs, County Auditor.

Motion by Hilmer, seconded by Kupka to approve the annual liquor license renewal for Backyard Vines LLC. Discussion: None. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Sheriff Schmidt was present to inform the Board of Supervisors that he had attended Civil School last week and during a breakout session mental health services were discussed. Sheriff Schmidt stated he had voiced his frustration that the core issue is being overlooked: the lack of resources and the increasingly limited mental health services available. He voiced his concerns about how the Sheriff's office, local law enforcement, and our county are bearing the financial and operational burden due to the lack of adequate services thanks to the state. He stated he does appreciate efforts in working toward getting things back on track, but he still believes we're creating "support" systems and mechanisms that don't fully tackle the real issue—the absence of sufficient mental health services in small rural counties. We shouldn't have to rely on law enforcement to provide these services. The jail may be secure, but it is not a proper mental health facility. He stated the good news is that funding for mental health medications for those incarcerated will continue after July 1st.

The Board recessed until 9:30 am.

At 9:30 am the Board held a public hearing to receive comments to repeal Ordinance VI.5(6.5) Wind Energy Conversion. Motion by Kupka, seconded by Turner to open the public hearing. All voted aye. Motion carried. There were members of the public present. Public comments: No written comments were received. Questions and comments were heard from the public.

Motion by Knebel, seconded by Turner to close the public hearing. All voted aye. Motion carried. Chairman Doland closed the public hearing at 9:38 am. Motion by Knebel, seconded by Turner to waive the 2nd and 3rd public hearings. Discussion: None. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Doland stated the next agenda item is to go into potential closed session pursuant to Iowa Code 21.5.1 (i) to evaluate the professional competency of an individual whose appointment, hiring, performance, or discharge is being considered when necessary to prevent needless and irreparable injury to that individual's reputation pursuant to the individual's request for a closed session. There has not been a request for closed session. Bob Vokoun was present and stated he did not want a closed session. Paul Greufe stated that Bob Vokoun was voluntarily resigning his position as Zoning/Weed Commissioner effective May 1st. Bob stated he had been planning to resign due to the time the job was taking. Motion by Knebel to accept Bob Vokoun's resignation as Zoning Administrator and Weed Commissioner effective immediately but with pay until May 1st, seconded by Kupka. Discussion: Bob wanted the public to know that he isn't just leaving and has things that need to be completed. Knebel stated that they would get an interim commissioner to handle those issues. Greufe stated from a HR perspective it is a voluntary resignation. When any employee gives a resignation, the Board makes a decision whether to accept the resignation and then a conversation of the effective date. The Board could say we accept your voluntary resignation effective immediately and we won't pay you, but this Board is considering saying we will honor your two weeks' notice and pay you for that time. It is not a termination; it is accepting the voluntary resignation honoring the original request. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Public Comments: Public comments were heard form Bob Vokoun, Craig Sash, Karen Murty, Andrea Dvorak, Richard Arp, Bill Fairlcoth, and Berleen Wobeter. Public comments closed at 10:16 am.

Chairman Doland adjourned the meeting at 10:17 am.


- 1. <u>Location Plan</u>. An applicant shall file a completed location plan as an attachment to this Utility Permit Application. The location plan shall set forth the location of the proposed line on the secondary road system and include a description of the proposed installation.
- 2. Written or Verbal Notice. At least two working days prior to the proposed installation, an applicant shall file with the County Engineer a notice stating the time, date, location and nature of the proposed installation.
- 3. <u>Inspection</u>. The County Engineer shall provide a full-time inspector during all permitted work done by a third party contractor. The inspector shall have the right, during reasonable hours and after showing proper identification, to enter any installation site in the discharge of the inspector's official duties, and to make any inspection or test that is reasonably necessary to protect the public health, safety and welfare. The cost of providing this inspection service shall be paid by the permit holder upon submission by Tama County of a bill for such services. All requirements listed in <u>4. Requirements</u> shall be met (less written exemptions) regardless of whom actually performs the work.
- 4. Requirements. The installation inspector shall assure that the following requirements have been met:
 - A) Construction signing shall comply with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.
 - B) Depth The minimum depth of cover shall be as follows:

 Telecommunications...36" Electric......48"

 Gas.......48" Water......60" Sewer......60"

 If the utility is installed in the road ditch and if the ditch has silted in above the original flowline, add the depth of silting to the "minimum depth" to obtain the required depth in a particular location.
 - C) The applicant shall use reference markers in the right of way ("R.O.W.") boundary to locate line and changes in alignment as required by the County Engineer. A permanent warning tape shall be placed one (1) foot above all underground utility lines.
 - D) All tile line locations shall be marked with references located in the R.O.W. line.
 - E) No underground utility lines shall cross over a crossroad drainage structure.
 - F) Residents along the utility route shall have uninterrupted access to the public roads. An all-weather access shall be maintained for residents adjacent to the project.
 - G) A joint assessment of the road surfacing shall be made by the applicant and the County Engineer both before and after construction. After construction, granular surfacing shall be added to the road by the applicant to restore the road to its original condition. After surfacing has been applied, the road surface shall be reviewed by the County Engineer (after the road has been saturated), to determine if additional surfacing on the roadway by the applicant is necessary.

In Columbia Township, sections 12 &13, T82N R15W, along M Ave, Tama. Starting at 3577 M Ave and ending at 3595 M Ave, installing single phase overhead line. Poles and anchors will be installed in backslope of ROW. Total line length is approximately 1784'. Moving line out of the PROW/trees and to the road



RESOLUTION 4-28-2025A

A Resolution Repealing Tama County Ordinance VI.5 (6.5) Wind Energy Conversion Assessment Ordinance

WHEREAS The Tama County Board of Supervisors is authorized, pursuant to Iowa Code Chapter 427B.26 Section 1. Subsection b., to repeal the ordinance for special valuation of wind energy conversion property; and

WHEREAS, Tama County Ordinance VI.5 (6.5) provides for the special valuation of wind energy conversion property pursuant to Iowa Code Chapter 427B.26; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has determined that the continuation of the special valuation provided under Section 4 of the ordinance ceases to be of benefit to the county; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Tama County, Iowa, that Tama County Ordinance VI.5 (6.5) Wind Energy Conversion Assessment Ordinance is hereby **REPEALED**.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that property specially valued under Section 4 prior to the repeal of the ordinance shall continue to be valued under Section 4 until the end of the 19th assessment year following the assessment year in which the property was first assessed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this resolution are hereby repealed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if any section, provision, or other part of this resolution shall be judged invalid or unconstitutional, said adjudication shall not affect the validity of the resolution as a whole or any section, provision, or other part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

This resolution shall be effective after its final passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.
