July 14, 2025

The Tama County Board of Supervisors met at 8:30 a.m. July 14, 2025. Present: 1st District Supervisor, Curt Hilmer; 2nd District Supervisor, David Turner; 3rd District Supervisor, Heather Knebel; 4th District Supervisor, Mark Doland and 5th District Supervisor, Curt Kupka. Also, Tama County Auditor, Karen Rohrs, members of the public, Deputy Dallas Dvorak, and Sheriff Schmidt.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Motion by Turner, seconded by Kupka to approve the agenda. Turner made a motion to amend the agenda to add 09-0264 as a tax sale reassignment for John Jacoby and under discussion/possible action to enter into negotiations with NextEra Energy that needs to be reworded to say Salt Creek Wind for a development agreement, seconded by Doland. Discussion: None. All voted aye. Motion carried. All voted aye to approve the agenda. Motion carried.

The Board met with Ben Daleske, Tama County Engineer, to get a road projects report. He also had a utility permit for the board chairman to sign. The permit is for Interstate Power and Light Co. along 200th St. and H Ave in Crystal Township. Motion by Knebel, seconded by Turner to approve the board chairman to sign the utility permit. Discussion: None. All voted aye. Motion carried.

A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE REGION 6 HOUSING TRUST FUND
2026 APPLICATION CASH CONTRIBUTION

Whereas the Region 6 Housing Trust Fund can apply for \$455,199 of Iowa Finance Authority (IFA) State Housing Trust Funds if the trust fund secures \$113,800 of local contributions, and Whereas the per capita state share for Tama County is \$84,068 if \$21,017 of local assistance is secured, and

Whereas there are currently 28 households on the waiting list for Tama County, and Whereas the IFA expects that 30% of the state funds be expended for households under 30% of the County median which is \$136,560 and it can be difficult some years to find projects under these income values, and

Whereas the Housing Trust Fund directly supports at least 8-10 construction jobs annually, and Whereas all the applicants must have annual incomes under 80% of the county median as determined by HUD.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TAMA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

Section 1: Tama County will provide \$21,017 of cash assistance for the 2026 Region 6 Housing Trust Fund application. This assistance will be provided in FY 26/27.

Knebel gave an update on the South-Central Iowa Workforce Region that she is a representative for with Tama County and explained how our region will need to merge with a larger region due to federal cuts. MESKWAKI NATION PROCLAMATION DAY

Tama County Board of Supervisors

Resolution Recognizing Meskwaki Nation Proclamation Day

WHEREAS, the Meskwaki Nation, formally known as the Sac & Fox Tribe of the Mississippi in Iowa, is

Iowa's only federally recognized Indian tribe and has a long-standing and resilient presence in Tama County; and

WHEREAS, on July 13, 1857, the Meskwaki people made history by purchasing land in Tama County, becoming the only Native American tribe in the United States to buy back a portion of their ancestral homeland, establishing what is now known as the Meskwaki Settlement; and

WHEREAS, the Meskwaki Tribal Council officially proclaimed July 13th as Meskwaki Nation Proclamation Day in 1992, to honor the foresight, courage, and determination of the original tribal leaders and families who secured a permanent home for future generations; and

WHEREAS, the Meskwaki Nation has since grown into a vibrant and self-sustaining community, contributing significantly to the cultural, economic, and social fabric of Tama County, and remains the county's largest employer; and

WHEREAS, the legacy of Chief Taimah, a prominent 19th-century Meskwaki leader known for his diplomacy, leadership, and efforts to protect his people's sovereignty and land, continues to inspire the Meskwaki Nation and the broader community. Chief Taimah's leadership during a time of great upheaval helped preserve the Meskwaki identity and laid the groundwork for future generations to reclaim and thrive on their ancestral lands; and

WHEREAS, the annual celebration of Meskwaki Nation Proclamation Day provides an opportunity for all residents of Tama County to reflect on the shared history, honor the resilience of the Meskwaki people, and celebrate the enduring partnership between the Meskwaki Nation and the surrounding communities;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Tama County Board of Supervisors hereby recognizes July 13th as Meskwaki Nation Proclamation Day in Tama County, Iowa, and encourages

all residents to join in honoring the Meskwaki Nation's rich heritage, cultural contributions, and continued commitment to community and sovereignty.

Roll Call Vote: Hilmer, aye. Turner, aye. Knebel, aye. Doland, aye. Kupka, aye. Resolution passed and adopted this 14th day of July, 2025. Mark Doland, Chairman, Board of Supervisors. Karen Rohrs, County Auditor.

Motion by Turner, seconded by Doland to approve entering into negotiations with Salt Creek Wind for a development agreement. Discussion: There was a lot of discussion between the Board.

Hilmer and Knebel does not want to drop litigation but see what Salt Creek has to say. Turner stated this opens the board up to discuss an agreement, but the final agreement would be brought before the Board and a lawyer before being cemented.

Roll Call Vote: Hilmer, aye. Turner, aye. Knebel, aye. Doland, aye. Kupka, aye. Motion carried.

Doland stated the Board will not end litigation until they have an agreement. Motion by Turner, seconded by Knebel to table terminating litigation in the Salt Creek Wind Project. Discussion: Knebel agreed 100% and didn't want to lose leverage. Doland stated he wanted a cease fire and if the Board is willing to come to the table, filings need to stop. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Motion by Kupka to appoint Doland and Turner as the two supervisors to negotiate with Salt Creek Wind. Discussion: It was discussed that it was better to have 2 supervisors negotiate instead of the full board to avoid a quorum. The votes were Kupka, aye. Turner, aye. Doland, aye. Knebel, nay. Hilmer abstained. Motion carried.

Motion by Turner, seconded by Kupka to approve the claims for payment as presented in the amount of \$913,920.85. Discussion: The higher amount in claims is due to property insurance premiums that are due. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Public Comments: Public comments were heard from Bob Vokoun, Richard Arp, Patrick Cornwell, Karen Murty, and Roger Wacha. Public comment time closed at 11:24 am.

Chairman Doland adjourned the meeting at 11:24 am.

Tama County Board of Supervisors - Weekly Engineer's Office Report

July 21st, 2025

We have working on the intersection of F Avenue and 280th St. doing some culvert and ditch work. Weather depending this week will get this rocked and opened.

We are working on a bridge on H Ave just north of E69. We will be placing back the beams and decking this week weather depending. We have all the decking for the project.

Have been rocking roads and out grading. We rocked 290th St. last week west of Hwy 63.

This week we will have a truck to take care of some edge ruts on paved roads.

We had 11 applicants for the Motor grader position in Dinsdale. We had some interviews on Friday and will have the rest of the interviews this week.

TAMA COUNTY UTILITY PERMIT APPLICATION

This is a Utility Permit Application for telecommunications, electric, gas, water and sewer utilities. The applicant agrees to comply with the following permit requirements. Compliance shall be determined by the sole discretion of the County Engineer as deemed necessary to promote public health, safety and the general welfare. These requirements shall apply unless waived in writing by the County Engineer prior to installation.

1. Location Plan. An applicant shall file a completed location plan as an attachment to this Utility Permit Application. The location plan shall set forth the location of the proposed line on the secondary road system and include a description of the proposed installation.
2. Written or Verbal Notice. At least two working days prior to the proposed installation, an applicant shall file with the County Engineer a notice stating the time, date, location and nature of the proposed installation.
3. Inspection. The County Engineer shall provide a full-time inspector during all permitted work done by a third party contractor. The inspector shall have the right, during reasonable hours and after showing proper identification, to enter any installation site in the discharge of the inspector's official duties, and to make any inspection or test that is reasonably necessary to protect the public health, safety and welfare. The cost of providing this inspection service shall be paid by the permit holder upon submission by Tama County of a bill for such services. All requirements listed in 4. Requirements shall be met (less written exemptions) regardless of whom actually performs the work.
4. Requirements. The installation inspector shall assure that the following requirements have been met:
 - A) Construction signing shall comply with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.
 - B) Depth – The minimum depth of cover shall be as follows:

Telecommunications....36"	Electric.....48"	
Gas.....48"	Water.....60"	Sewer.....60"

If the utility is installed in the road ditch and if the ditch has silted in above the original flowline, add the depth of silting to the "minimum depth" to obtain the required depth in a particular location.
 - C) The applicant shall use reference markers in the right of way ("R.O.W.") boundary to locate line and changes in alignment as required by the County Engineer. A permanent warning tape shall be placed one (1) foot above all underground utility lines.
 - D) All tile line locations shall be marked with references located in the R.O.W. line.
 - E) No underground utility lines shall cross over a crossroad drainage structure.
 - F) Residents along the utility route shall have uninterrupted access to the public roads. An all-weather access shall be maintained for residents adjacent to the project.
 - G) A joint assessment of the road surfacing shall be made by the applicant and the County Engineer both before and after construction. After construction, granular surfacing shall be added to the road by the applicant to restore the road to its original condition. After surfacing has been applied, the road surface shall be reviewed by the County Engineer (after the road has been saturated), to determine if additional surfacing on the roadway by the applicant is necessary.

- H) All damaged areas within the R.O.W. shall be repaired and restored to at least its former condition by the applicant or the cost of any repair work caused to be performed by the County will be assessed against the applicant.
- I) Areas disturbed during construction which present an erosion problem shall be solved by the applicant in a manner approved by the County Engineer.
- J) All trenches, excavations, and utilities that are knifed shall be properly tamped.
- K) All utilities shall be located between the bottom of the backslope and the bottom of the foreslope, unless otherwise approved in writing by the County Engineer prior to installation.
- L) Road crossings shall be bored. The minimum depth below the road surface shall match the minimum depth of cover for the respective utility. All entrances with culverts shall either be bored or, the utility shall be placed at least 24" below the bottom elevation of the culvert.

5. Non-Conforming Work. The County Engineer may halt the installation at any time if the applicant's work does not meet the requirements set forth in this Utility Permit.
6. Emergency Work. In emergency situations, work may be initiated by an applicant without first obtaining a Utility Permit. However, a Utility Permit must be obtained within fourteen (14) days of initiation of the work. All emergency work shall be done in conformity with the provisions of this ordinance and shall be inspected for full compliance.
7. County Infraction. Violation of this permit is a county infraction under Iowa Code section 331.307, punishable by a civil penalty of \$100 for each violation or if the infraction is a repeat offense a civil penalty not to exceed two hundred dollars for each repeat offense. Each day that a violation occurs or is permitted to exist by the applicant constitutes a separate offense.
8. Hold Harmless. The utility company shall save this County harmless of any damages resulting from the applicant's operations. A copy of a certificate of insurance naming this county as an additional named insured for the permit work shall be filed in the County Engineer's office prior to installation. The minimum limits of liability under the insurance policy shall be \$1,000,000.
9. Permit Required. No applicant shall install any lines unless such applicant has obtained a Utility Permit from the county Engineer and has agreed in writing that said installation will comply with all ordinances and requirements of the County for such work. Applicants agree to hold the County free from liability for all damage to applicant's property which occurs proximately as a result of the applicant's failure to comply with said ordinances or requirements.
10. Relocation. The applicant shall, at any time subsequent to installation of utility lines, at the applicant's own expense, relocate or remove such lines as may become necessary to conform to new grades, alignment or widening of R.O.W. resulting from maintenance or construction operations for highway improvements.

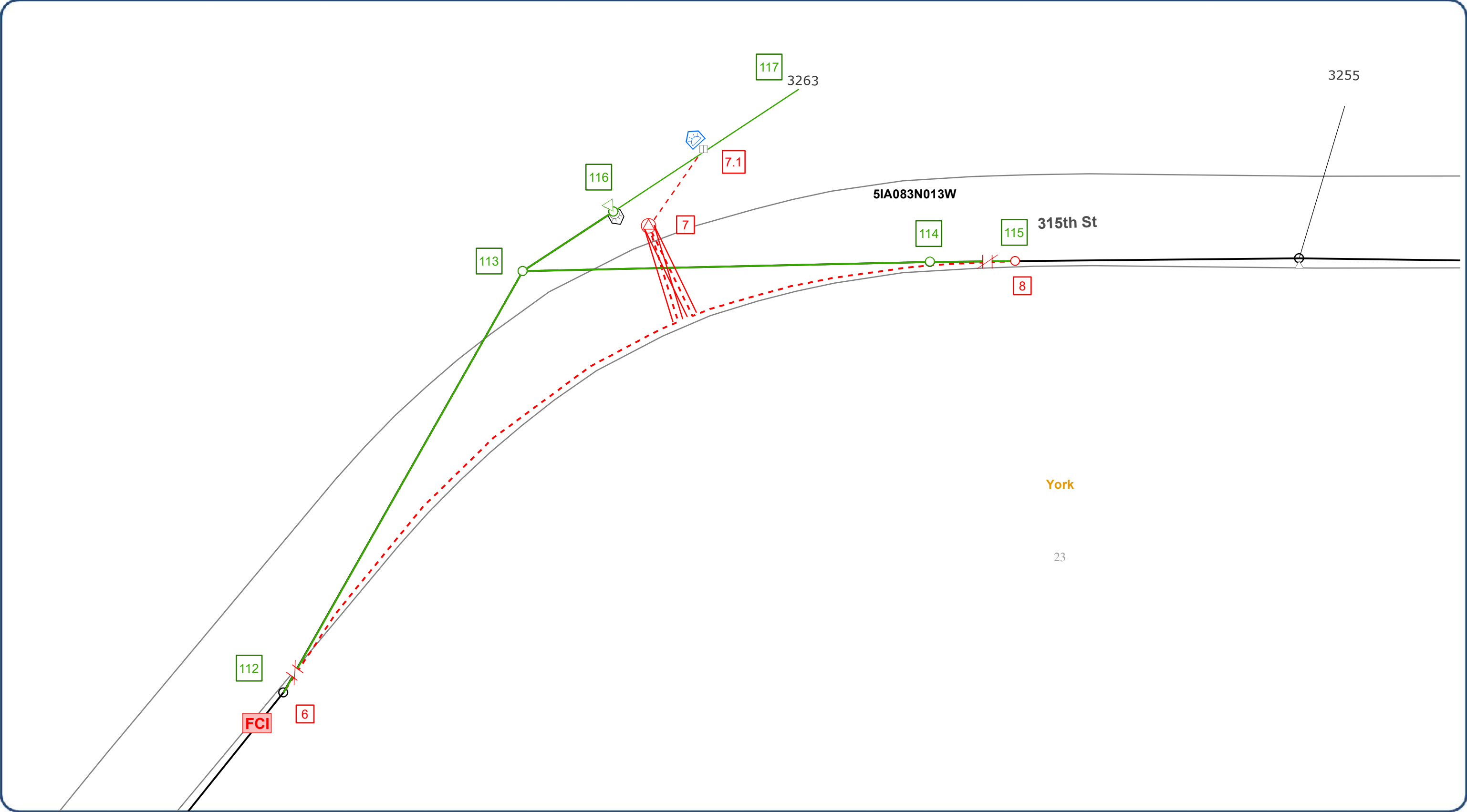

Install marked in Red

Retire marked in Green

Pt 6 – Existing pole, install a guy 15' NE and install 1PH UG cable NE along S side of road to padmounted transformer at #7 in private property at 3263 315th St. The road crossing will be in 2" duct.

Pt 7 – Install padmounted transformer on private property. Install UG cable to #8. The road crossing will be in 2" duct.

Pt 8 – Install a new pole and guy 15' W, on the S side of the road.

The new cable will be installed to the back of the ROW and a minimum of 48" deep.

A copy of a certificate of insurance naming this county as an additional named insured for the permit work shall be filed in the County Engineer's office prior to installation. The minimum limits of liability under the insurance policy shall be \$1,000,000.
9. Permit Required. No applicant shall install any lines unless such applicant has obtained a Utility Permit from the county Engineer and has agreed in writing that said installation will comply with all ordinances and requirements of the County for such work. Applicants agree to hold the County free from liability for all damage to applicant's property which occurs proximately as a result of the applicant's failure to comply with said ordinances or requirements.
10. Relocation. The applicant shall, at any time subsequent to installation of utility lines, at the applicant's own expense, relocate or remove such lines as may become necessary to conform to new grades, alignment or widening of R.O.W. resulting from maintenance or construction operations for highway improvements.

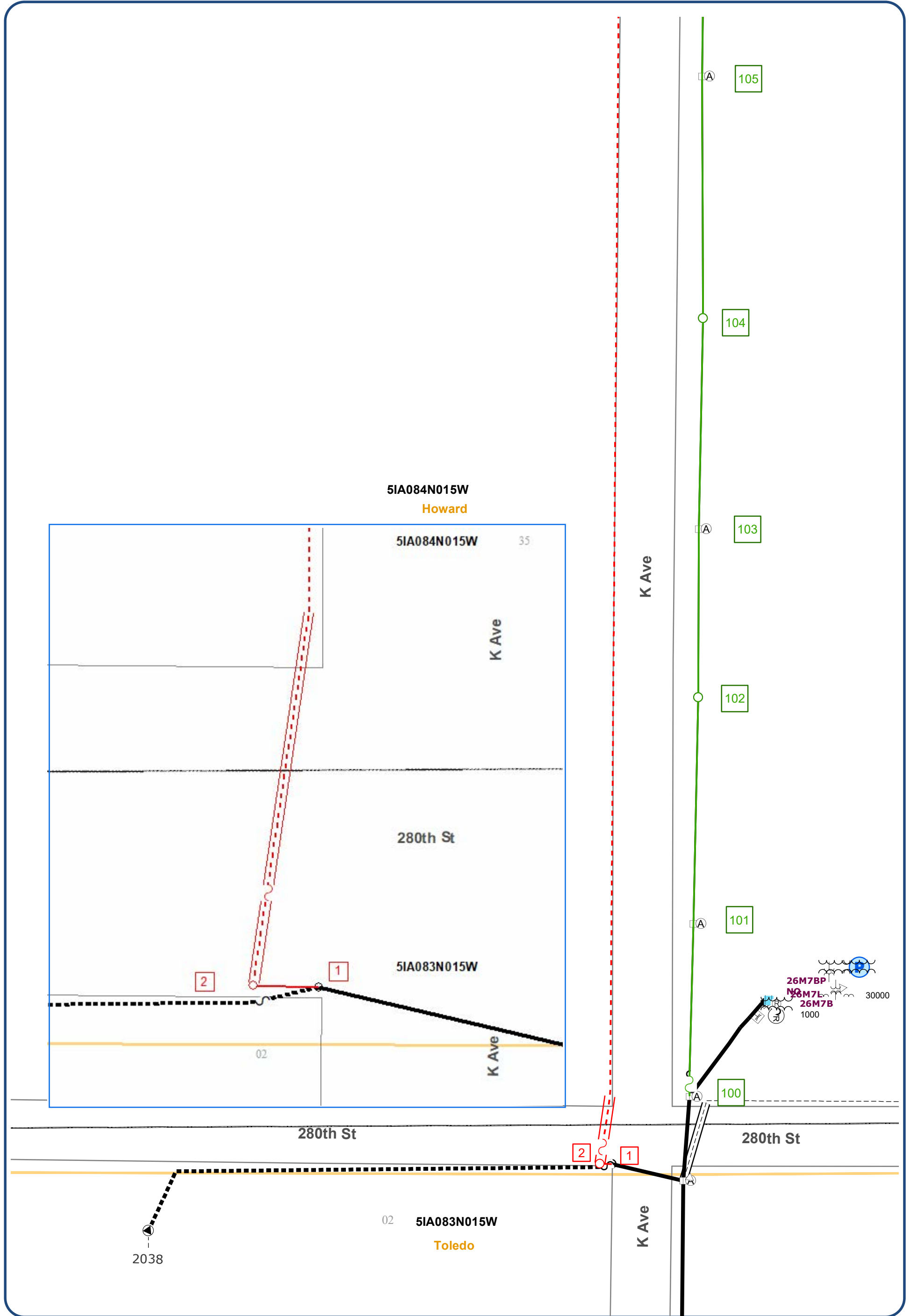

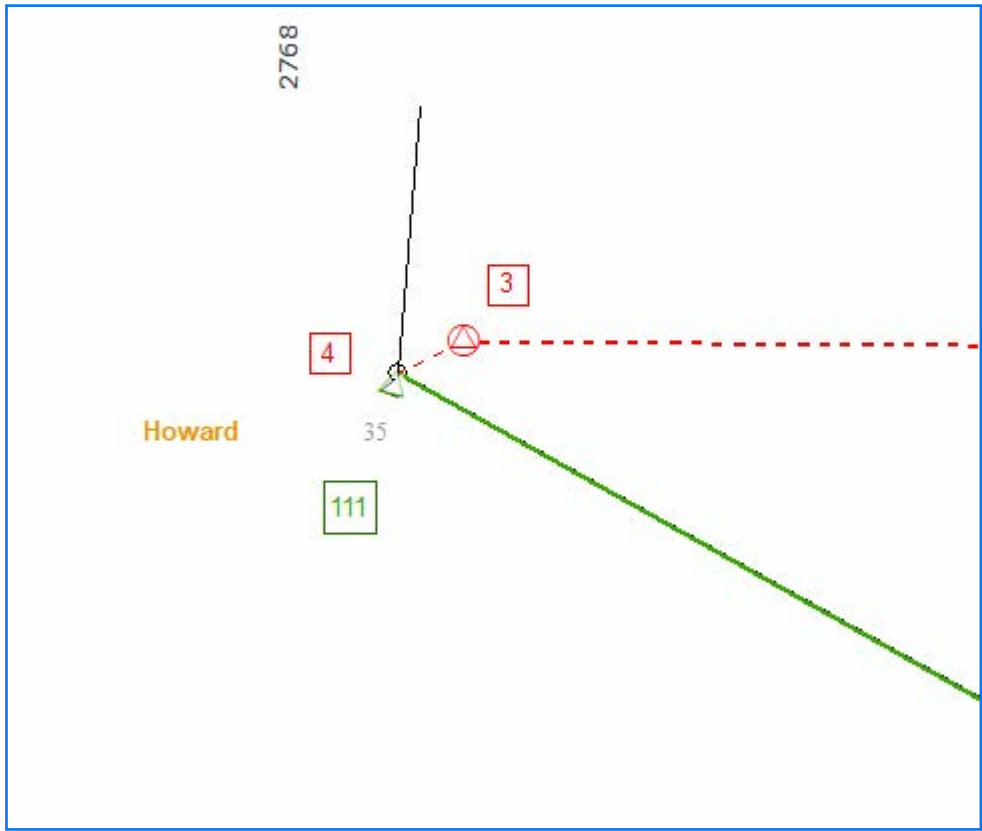

1. Location Plan. An applicant shall file a completed location plan as an attachment to this Utility Permit Application. The location plan shall set forth the location of the proposed line on the secondary road system and include a description of the proposed installation.
2. Written or Verbal Notice. At least two working days prior to the proposed installation, an applicant shall file with the County Engineer a notice stating the time, date, location and nature of the proposed installation.
3. Inspection. The County Engineer shall provide a full-time inspector during all permitted work done by a third party contractor. The inspector shall have the right, during reasonable hours and after showing proper identification, to enter any installation site in the discharge of the inspector's official duties, and to make any inspection or test that is reasonably necessary to protect the public health, safety and welfare. The cost of providing this inspection service shall be paid by the permit holder upon submission by Tama County of a bill for such services. All requirements listed in 4. Requirements shall be met (less written exemptions) regardless of whom actually performs the work.
4. Requirements. The installation inspector shall assure that the following requirements have been met:
 - A) Construction signing shall comply with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.
 - B) Depth – The minimum depth of cover shall be as follows:

Telecommunications....36"	Electric.....48"	
Gas.....48"	Water.....60"	Sewer.....60"

If the utility is installed in the road ditch and if the ditch has silted in above the original flowline, add the depth of silting to the "minimum depth" to obtain the required depth in a particular location.
 - C) The applicant shall use reference markers in the right of way ("R.O.W.") boundary to locate line and changes in alignment as required by the County Engineer. A permanent warning tape shall be placed one (1) foot above all underground utility lines.
 - D) All tile line locations shall be marked with references located in the R.O.W. line.
 - E) No underground utility lines shall cross over a crossroad drainage structure.
 - F) Residents along the utility route shall have uninterrupted access to the public roads. An all-weather access shall be maintained for residents adjacent to the project.
 - G) A joint assessment of the road surfacing shall be made by the applicant and the County Engineer both before and after construction. After construction, granular surfacing shall be added to the road by the applicant to restore the road to its original condition. After surfacing has been applied, the road surface shall be reviewed by the County Engineer (after the road has been saturated), to determine if additional surfacing on the roadway by the applicant is necessary.

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- J) All trenches, excavations, and utilities that are knifed shall be properly tamped.

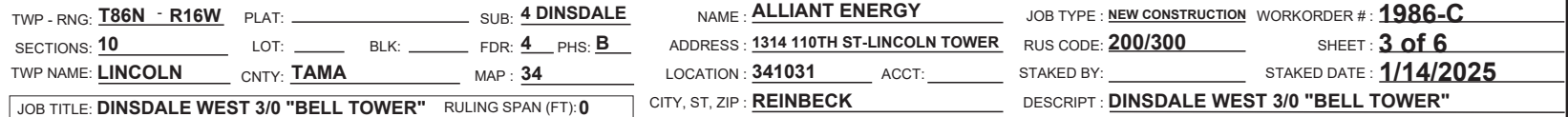

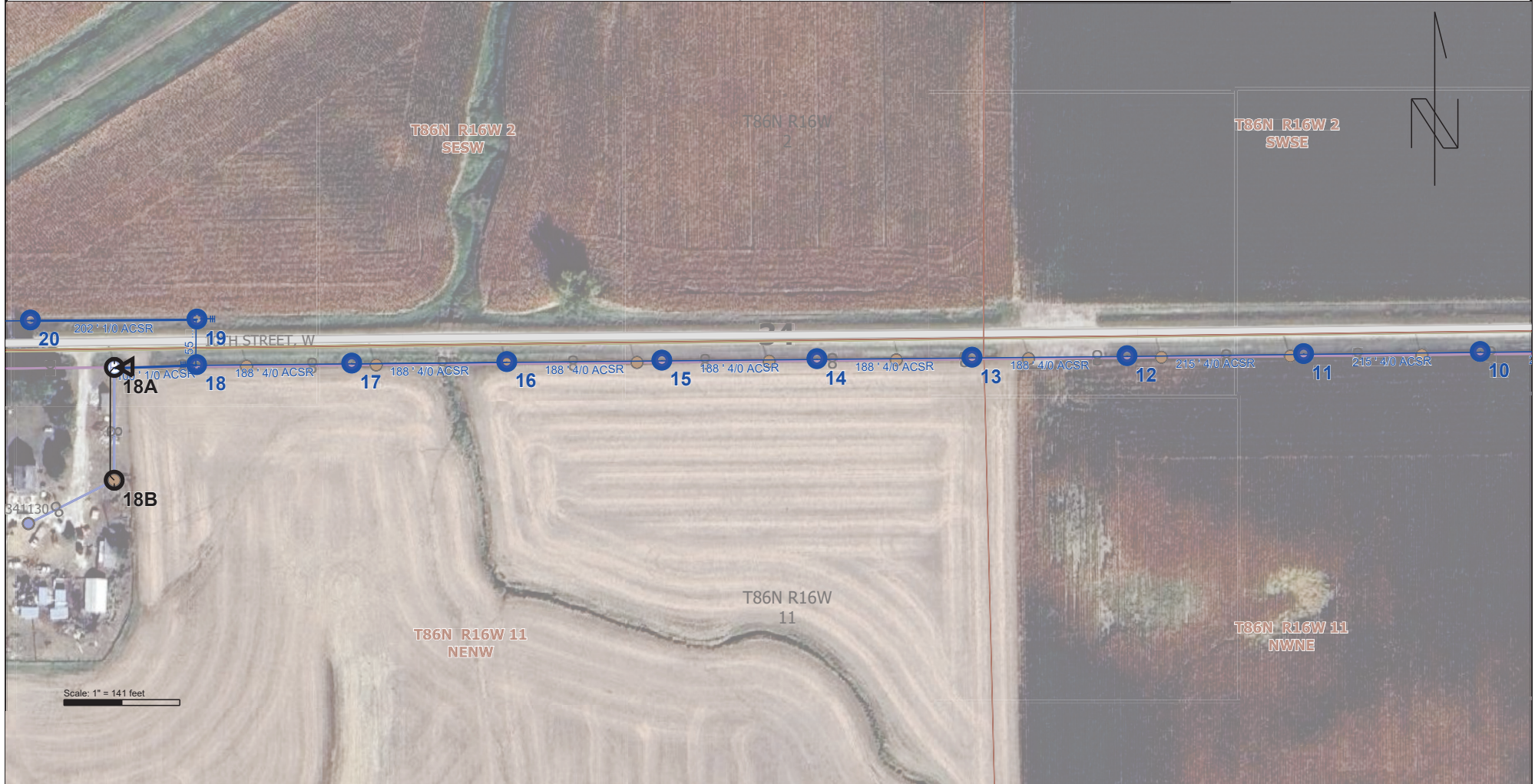

EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY POLICY

Equal Employment Opportunity

It is the objective of Tama County to encourage employment and advancement of all individuals in a way that will utilize their talents to the maximum and develop their skills most effectively in a work and community environment that is free from discrimination.

Tama County has a policy to provide equal opportunity for all where employment is based upon personal capabilities and qualifications without discrimination because of race, age, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, mental or physical disabilities, religious affiliations, genetic information, or any other protected characteristic as established by law.

This policy of equal employment opportunity applies to all policies and procedures relating to recruitment and hiring, compensation, benefits, promotion, termination and all other terms and conditions of employment.

Harassment

It is the policy of Tama County that no employee be harassed by another employee, customer, or supervisor on the basis of race, age, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, mental or physical disabilities, religious affiliations, genetic information, veteran status or any other legally protected category.

Illegal harassment, whether verbal or physical, will not be tolerated. All members of management have the explicit responsibility and duty to take corrective action to prevent any illegal harassment of our employees.

If any employee believes that he or she has been subjected to illegal harassment, that employee should bring the matter directly to the immediate attention of an elected official, supervisor, department head, HR representative, a member of the Board of Supervisors or appropriate governing board. All complaints will be investigated, and appropriate disciplinary action taken, up to and including termination. There will be no retaliation against anyone who submits a good faith harassment complaint or participates in an investigation relating to such a complaint.

Sexual Harassment

It is the policy of Tama County that no employee be harassed by another employee or supervisor on the basis of sex.

The policy prohibits any demand for sexual favors that is accompanied by a promise of favorable job treatment or a threat concerning the employee's employment. Also prohibited are subtle

pressures for sexual favors, including implying that an applicant's or employee's cooperation of a sexual nature, or refusal thereof, will have any effect on the person's employment, job assignment, wages, promotion, or any other condition of employment.

In addition, any behavior of a sexual nature not welcomed by the employee or found to be personally offensive is expressly forbidden. This includes but is not limited to:

- a. Repeated sexual flirtations, advances, or propositions.
- b. Continued or repeated verbal abuse of a sexual nature, sexually related comments and joking, graphic or degrading comments about the employee's appearance or the display of sexually suggestive objects or pictures.
- c. Any uninvited physical contact or touching, such as patting, pinching or other contact.
- d. Conduct that has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with an individual's work performance or creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive work environment.

Sexual harassment, whether verbal or physical, will not be tolerated. All members of management have the explicit responsibility and duty to take corrective action to prevent any sexual harassment of our employees.

As with other forms of harassment, any employee who believes that he or she has been subjected to sexual harassment should bring the matter directly to the immediate attention of an elected official, supervisor, department head, HR representative, a member of the Board of Supervisors or appropriate governing board. All complaints or reports of sexual harassment will be investigated and appropriate disciplinary action taken, up to and including termination. There will be no retaliation against anyone who submits a good faith sexual harassment complaint or participates in an investigation relating to such a complaint.
